# Superintendent's Notes

## When Will it End?!

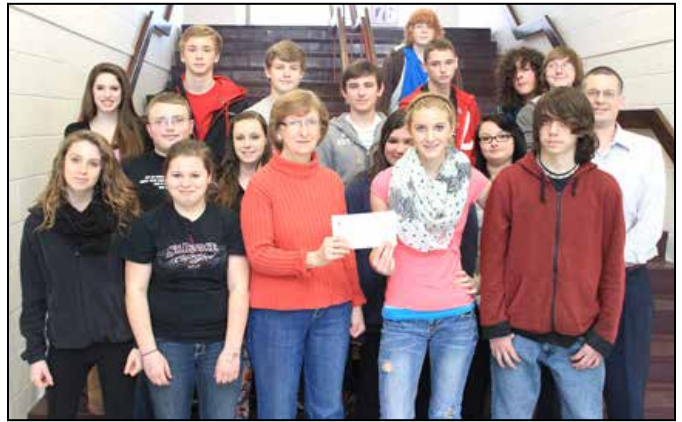
That's been a question asked of me often the past few weeks. Some are asking about *winter* -- and others are asking about the *school year!* Many questions arise because of our rough winter conditions, combined with widespread news media coverage explaining that the State only allows schools six snow day/inclementment weather cancellations. Beyond six days, districts may have to add days to the end of the school year. While this is generally true, there is a bit of wiggle room in the law for districts like BPS that schedule more than the minimum required school days and hours during the school year.

## Number of School Days Required

A few years ago, the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) set a rule that schools could not schedule fewer days of instruction than the number in their 2009-10 approved school calendar. Bellaire had 172 school days of student instruction that year. Since 2009-10, BPS has scheduled 175 school days -- *three more than the minimum required.* As a result, the MDE staff that monitors each district's "days and clock hour reports" recently informed us that because our 2013-14 schedule has three more school days than the minimum required, we would be allowed an additional three days off for inclement weather. That totals **nine** snow day cancellations at BPS before having to make any days up.

## Snow Days So Far...

As of Friday, February 28, we have had **ten** snow day cancellations. Plus, with the months of March and April ahead of us, we may see more severe winter weather. BPS **will** have to add one or more days to the end of the school year, depending on how many additional cancellations are necessary. In the weeks to come, we will develop a schedule to make up the snow days and notify you as soon as possible.

## Getting Down to Business

Business management teacher, Mr. Smith instructs his students on what it takes to operate a small business. Watch for a reading month calendar and enjoy all the special days we have planned. Plus, the reading tips below are ways for families to perform a reading time rescue with an up-up-and away booster!

- Choose a quiet place for reading, free from distractions.
- Point out spelling/sound patterns like cat, pat, hat.
- When your child misses a word, identify it and help her read the word correctly.
- After stopping to correct a word, reread the entire sentence to ensure comprehension.
- Retell the story in your own words.
- Ask questions about the characters and events.
- Guess why a character acted in a certain way.
- Before the end of a story, ask what might happen next and why.

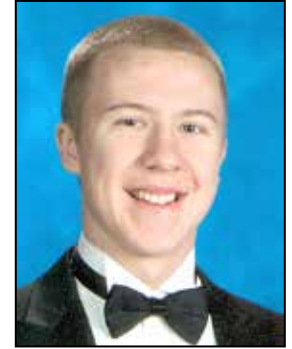

## Scholar Athlete Award



Bellaire senior MacKenzie Ciganick was selected as one of only four Class D recipients of the MHSAA Scholar Athlete Award. Farm Bureau Insurance sponsors the award, giving \$1,000 college scholarships to 32 high school athletes.

Mackenzie has participated at high levels in three sports for nearly her entire high school career. Soccer, basketball, and track and field are the areas where she focused her efforts. With the BPS boys soccer team for four years, she was part of the 2013 Regional championship, earned Academic All-State for three years, and also competed on a separate league team.

MacKenzie is a member of the National Honor Society and was on the school's athletic council. Outside of school, she serves as her church's teen representative and as school president for the Antrim County Youth Coalition. Upon graduation, she will attend Michigan State University to study pre-med.
