On November 8, 2016 Bellaire Public Schools is seeking a renewal of the 18 mill nonhomestead property tax. This millage renewal will not result in any cost to homeowners for their primary residence. The 18 mills is only levied on non-homestead property (such as business, certain commercial, and industrial property and second homes). This is also the same tax that has been levied since the introduction of Proposal A in the mid-1990's and is not an increase in taxes to be levied. The District is requesting that voters approve 20 mills for a period of six years, however, this will not result in a tax increase on any property within the District. The maximum rate that can be levied by the District is 18 mills. The additional two mills are only available to restore millage that may be lost or reduced due to a Headlee rollback, which can occur when property values increase quickly.

The funds collected under the 18 mill non-homestead tax are critical to school operations and are used for staffing, educational programs, and other operating expenses.

Again, this millage will not result in any cost to homeowners for their primary residence.



Bellaire Robotics in Full Swing



Bellaire Middle School and High School robotics programs are in full swing

and going strong. There are more than 30 students participating in middle school robotics, currently building and programming Mindstorm EV3 robots to perform complex tasks such as shooting targets, knocking over objects, and traveling through obstacle courses. They are working on their first robot model called The Track3r which can also be remote controlled from a remote device or via a Bluetooth connection from a smart phone. As the challenges become more difficult, the students continue to step up and excel in programing and engineering the robots.

Two high school teams are preparing for contests against area schools in the VEX Robotics Competition game, Starstruck. The Starstuck objective is to score as many points as possible by using a robot to move objects over a fence in the arena. The objects include stars and cubes. Each team engineers a robot using various motors, switches, and other structural components. Once the robot is engineered and assembled, the team then programs it for an autonomous period to start the match. During this period, robots can score points only by having preprogramed instructions. This is a very challenging task, but the teams are working diligently to be ready for competition.
