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## **Read –at-Home Plan**

Although the classroom teachers target literacy specifically 60-90 minutes daily the skills are implemented across all subject areas.

Only **27%** of your child's learning takes place at **school.**

**You** are your child's teacher **63%** of the time. **Almost 2/3 of every year you are your child's teacher.**  
**You are by far the most important and we count on you!!**

Looking at the fall assessment data, if your child is determined to be at risk for 3<sup>rd</sup> grade retention, a Read-at-Home Plan will be developed together by you and the literacy team (Mrs. Poel, Mrs. Beatty-Title 1 teacher, classroom teacher). Family involvement and understanding will be critical in helping your child meet PA306 expectations.

## **Individual Reading Improvement Plan (IRIP)**

The Individual Reading Improvement Plan (IRIP) is a formal "Student Success Plan " and outlines the additional instructional support your child will need at school and home in order to reach their maximum reading potential. Based on the results of the reading assessments it will be determined whether or not an IRIP will be required in order to meet proficiency standards. A formal plan will be developed as a team and together we will determine teacher, parent and student responsibilities.

**\*Your approval of this reading plan is a requirement of law PA306**

Based on September assessment scores, if your child is at risk of not meeting PA306 standards, you will be notified in a separate note.

As grade level standards increase in rigor, your child's performance may vary. Therefore, your child's status may change based on ongoing instruction, learning and assessment. Our entire staff is eager to work with you to ensure your child receives the appropriate literacy instruction and becomes a strong reader in order to meet the requirements to be promoted to 4<sup>th</sup> grade.
